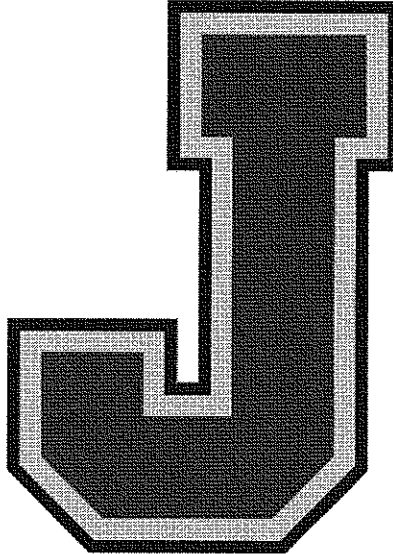

Program Notes

How to Train Your Dragon (2010), John Powell, Arranged By Sean O'Loughlin

John Powell is an English composer who writes primarily for animated movies. His list of films includes *Antz*, *Chicken Run*, *Shrek*, *Robots*, *Happy Feet*, *Ice Age*, *Rio*, and *How To Train Your Dragon*. Despite the film being centered around a Viking community, Powell draws upon Celtic Influences scoring the music with traditional Bagpipe and Fiddle music in mind.

Hedwig's Theme (2001), John Williams, Arranged by Victor Lopez

This excerpt from the extensive *Harry Potter* soundtrack features the widely known title theme. The first statement of the melody is introduced by mallet percussion before being joined by the rest of the ensemble.

Star Trek Into Darkness (2013), Michael Giacchino, Arranged by Michael Brown

This arrangement features many of the themes heard in *Star Trek (2009)* but now in a much more different and darker coloring. Tension, suspension, and juxtaposition; the result is a high energy, driving medley that relentlessly pursues resolution until the final measure.

The Patriot (2000) John Williams, Arranged by John Moss

The movie of the same title is set on in the backdrop of the American Revolutionary war and follows the story of an American who is swept into the war when his family is threatened. I think Williams captures the promise of hope embedded within the American spirit in this score.

Selections from "Man of Steel" (2013), Hans Zimmer, Arranged by Ralph Ford

Each year the senior band class elects to revisit one of the 85+ concert band pieces that they studied during their time in the JHS Band. This was last performed in May of 2015 and is this class's senior piece.

Godzilla Eats Las Vegas (1996) Erik Whitacre

Written for a film that does not exist (and likely never will), this piece is a highly entertaining, dramatic, and over the top depiction of the famous mega-lizard Godzilla wrecking havoc on the people of Las Vegas. Listeners are encouraged to follow along with the script written by the composer and included in tonight's program.

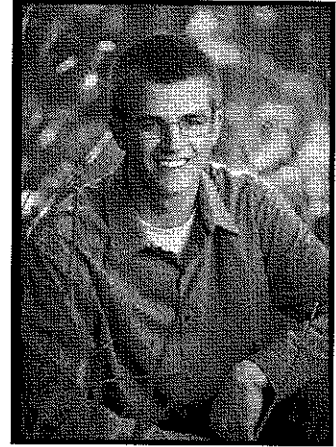
Name: Philip Atneosen

Advice, wisdom, or words of encouragement for current and future JHS band members: Practice a lot, and have fun.

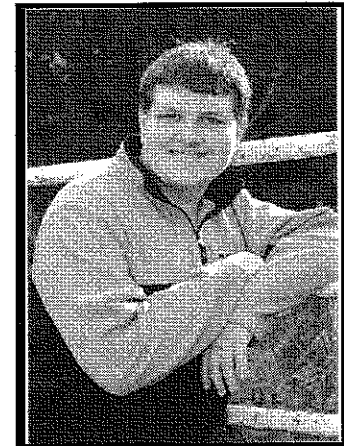
Name: Jacob Pauly

Advice, wisdom, or words of encouragement for current and future JHS band members: Keep your eye on the ball.

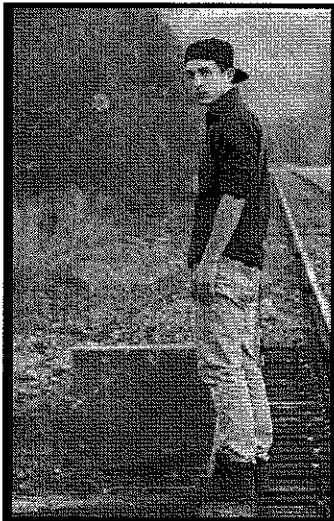
Name: Abigail Weber

Instrument(s): Flute, 8 years; Piccolo, 3 years; Saxophone, 3 years

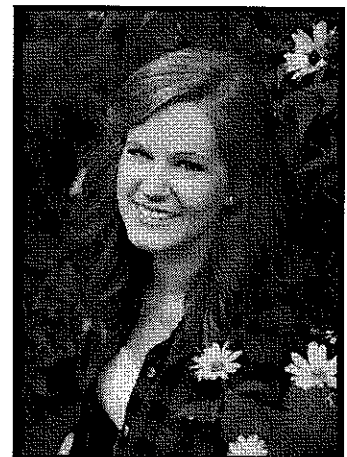
Plans after graduation: Attend Gustavus Adolphus College and major in Chemistry and Minor in Music.

WIDE PAN

As Godzilla heads down the strip, searching relentlessly for:

CLOSE UP (stock footage)

Frank Sinatra (Stomped!)

CLOSE UP (stock footage)

Wayne Newton (Stamped!)

CLOSE UP (stock footage)

Liberace (Stepped upon!)

VARIOUS CUTS

The Village Gods destroyed, Godzilla continues his carnage until the City of Sin is leveled!

***** P A R T T W O *****

FADE UP

A fearless army of Elvises (Elvi) appear in the distance, formation marching through the littered streets

VARIOUS CLOSE UPS

The Elvi attack, using bombers, missiles, etc.

EXTREME CLOSE UP

One wicked laugh from Godzilla and the Elvi scatter like mice!

QUICK CUT (stock footage)

The Sphinx sits outside the Luxor, looking seductive in a Mae West sort of way.

CLOSE UP

Godzilla takes one look and his eyes pop out of his head.

QUICK CUTS

The Sphinx (Sphinxstress?) seduces the reptile, who instantly falls in love and begins to:

WIDE SHOT

Tango with her.

SPLIT SCREEN

As they dance, the Elvi slowly regroup and head for the:

QUICK CUT (stock footage)

Pirate ships at Treasure Island.

ACTION SEQUENCE (MONTAGE)

The Elvi approach the dancing monster and launch a ferocious volley of cannonballs directly at him.

QUICK CLOSE UPS

The cannonballs find their mark, and Godzilla:

WIDE SHOT

Falls to the ground, annihilated. The Elvi are triumphant!

CROSSFADE

The lounge is open again, and the city of Las Vegas toasts the victory. The scene climaxes with:

VARIOUS CUTS (stock footage)

People happy, tearful, etc. Stock footage, stock music.

SLOW FADE OUT AND FADE UP

A dark, ominous, and VERY familiar sound...

SLOW ZOOM

Godzilla lives! Godzilla lives! Complete terror (possible sequel?).

WIDE SHOT

The Show is over. The End.

FADE TO BLACK
