**“Mars” from THE PLANETS (2009/1914), Gustav Holst, Arr. William Owens**

The Planets suite is one of the iconic band works of the 20th century, with “Mars” being perhaps the most recognizable. It has been used in numerous movies, most notably science fiction films. It begins with a driving ostinato rhythm that leads into an ominous and building bass line that defines much of the character of the work. The piece rises to a dramatic climax that leaves the listener feeling the weight of each unison note until the final beat.

**Selections from “Up” (2009), Michael Giacchino, Arr. Michael Brown**

This playful medley features some of the prominent themes from Disney and Pixar’s *Up*. The legato melodic lines arc and descend much like a balloon floating in the wind painting a picture that mirrors what happens on screen.

**O Magnum Mysterium (2003), Morten Lauridsen, Arr. Robert Reynolds**

This is a setting of the composer’s 1994 choral work for Wind Band. Reynolds preserves the rich, deep harmonic structure of the original work and pairs it beautifully with the color of the wind ensemble to create an environment for something very special. The title translates to “O Great Mystery”. This is one of the band’s large group contest pieces.

**Arabesque (2009), Samuel R. Hazo**

Arabesque is a piece written in the musical style of the composer’s Arabic roots. It is composed in three parts; “Taqsim” or a bi-tonal, microtonal, improvisation which features a flute soloist; “Dabka,” or a traditional celebrative Arabic line dance often performed at weddings; and culminates in a “Chorale” which recapitulates the previous mystical themes of the composition. This is one of the band’s large group contest pieces.

**La Virgen De La Macarena (1951), Arr. Rafael Mendez**

La Virgen de la Macarena is the favorite Virgin of Sevilla, Spain. Also called La Esperanza, she is considered the protector of bullfighters. One of Spain’s most legendary matadors, Jose Ortega, presented the Virgin with five emerald brooches, hoping for protection. It worked for eight years....until he was gored to death in the ring. The statue still bears the five brooches to this day. This features our guest “bull fighter,” Robert Baca.

**Bugler’s Holiday (1954), Leroy Anderson**

Leroy Anderson is one of the most beloved of American composers. His music has delighted audiences for almost a century with such tunes as *The Typewriter Song*, *The Penny Whistle Song*, *A Trumpeter’s Lullaby*, and *Sleigh Ride*. Interestingly none of his tunes last more than three minutes, and this work is no exception. Our performance tonight will feature Professor Baca and all of the trumpets in the JHS Band.

**Robert Baca**

Growing up in Lockport, IL, Bob Baca decided to go into music the first time he heard Adolf Herseth perform Mahler’s Fifth Symphony with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra. After attending Indiana University he toured with Buddy Rich, Frank Sinatra, Mel Torme and Tony Bennett before getting married and settling in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Soon after, a dream came true, moving to Wisconsin almost thirty years ago to teach at the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire where Robert teaches trumpet and is the director of Jazz Studies. His students and ensembles have been highly acclaimed recording nineteen CD’s all with critical review, as well as receiving two Grammy nominations and the Down Beat Award for Best College Jazz Ensemble six times. The New York Times cites UW-Eau Claire as having “one of the most well-regarded jazz studies programs in the country.” Without a Jazz degree, as the Jazz Area expanded, Robert founded Eau Claire Jazz Inc., which among performing many civic activities, organizes one of the nations largest jazz festivals. <http://www.eauclairejazz.com> .

Eau Claire Jazz Inc. acts as a bridge to the community with sixteen community board members, nine interns and one hundred and ten engaged jazz students. Robert received the first, “Career Excellence in Teaching Award” presented by the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire and was runner up for teacher of the year in the University of Wisconsin System.

Outside of Eau Claire, Robert played as a member of Garrison Keillor’s beloved “The Guys All Star Shoe Band”, Blood Sweat and Tears, and hundreds of Broadway shows, supporting artist shows and recording sessions.

He is a past executive board member for the International Association for Jazz Education (IAJE) as the United States Representative as well as an advisory board member for the Edwin Franko Goldman Band.

Robert Baca loves to work with students of all ages through performing concerts, conducting honors groups and speaking in schools, at teacher in-service workshops and conventions. As a result, thousands of students are enjoying music as performers, teachers, listeners and supporters. Last October, he conducted the National High School Honors Jazz Ensemble for the *National Association for Music Education* at their national convention in Nashville, Tennessee.
